INFORMATION OF CAMBRIDGE LANGUAGE EXAMS for children of ZŠ Ostrčilova



Our school is going to organise Cambridge English exams for children and students in May 2024. Your children will have a chance to take a **YLE** (Starters, Movers, Flyers level), **A2 Key** for Schools, **B1 Preliminary** for Schools (more info below). These exams will take place in the Ostrčilova school building.

The **B2** First for Schools will be held at the building of Cloverleaf Language school, address: Dolní 31, Ostrava-Zábřeh. As a result of the exam, the children will receive Cambridge certificates. These certificates prove their English skills. This certificate will show them what they already know in English and inspire them to continue studying English language. The certificates are valid for unlimited period of time therefore it is possible to use them for further studies in high school or abroad.



- First choose the right type of the exam which takes place at the Ostrčilova school or Cloverleaf and click, Objednat".
- Fill in the registration form: your child's first name (jméno), surname (příjmení), date of birth (datum narození) and your email and phone number. Read registration conditions and Regulations and then clic two boxes: "Podmínky registrace k jazykové zkoušce Cambridge" and "Shrnutí nařízení pro kandidáty" for confirmation you have read them.
- Click "pokračovat" to go on. Choose an option "převodem (fakturou)" which means you want to pay the exam fee by bank transfer. Then click "pokračovat".
- Finally, click the box ("Souhlasím s obchodními podmínkami") you agree with the terms and conditions and put a note "ZŠ Ostrčilova" in the field "poznámka".
- Send the registration by clicking on "závazně objednat".
- You will get an exam registration summary to your email containing an account number (číslo účtu) and variable symbol (variabilní symbol) where you can pay the exam fee.

3. Registration and payment dates:

- Please pay for the exam on 10th March 2024 at the latest (only until this date your children will be able to apply as a priority) you can apply after this date too if there is still a place available (but no later than the application deadline specified for the given exam on the website) because we will also accept applications from students from other schools for these exams after 10th March.
- 4. **Detailed information of the exam, including a detailed timetable for the exam,** will be sent to the email address provided in the online registration 3 days after the application deadline.



Exams YLE

Young Learners (YLE) is a series of fun, motivating English language tests, aimed at children in primary and lower-secondary education (7-12 years old).







There are three activity-based tests – Starters, Movers and Flyers. This gives students a clear path to improve in English.

The maximum score is five shields for each part of the test.
